#### **Sacred Scripture**

##### **Isaiah 49:1-7**

Listen to me, O coastlands;  
pay attention, you peoples from far away.  
The Holy One called me before I was born;

while I was still forming in the womb,  
I was named.

The Holy One made my mouth like a sharp sword;  
in the shadow of divine presence I was hidden.  
I was shaped into a polished arrow,  
kept safe in the quiver of love.

And the Voice said to me,  
“You are my servant, my people Israel,  
through whom my glory will be revealed.”

But I said,  
“I have laboured in vain;  
I have spent my strength for nothing and emptiness.”  
Yet my cause rests with the Holy One,  
and my worth is held by my God.

And now the Holy One speaks—  
the One who formed me in the womb for service,  
to gather Jacob back,  
to bring Israel home.  
I am honoured in the sight of the Holy One,  
and my God has become my strength.

And the Voice says:  
“It is too small a thing  
that you should only restore the tribes of Jacob  
and gather the survivors of Israel.  
I will give you as a light to the nations,

that my saving power  
may reach to the ends of the earth.”

Thus says the Holy One,  
the Redeemer of Israel,  
to one deeply rejected,  
despised by nations,  
enslaved by rulers:  
“Those in power will see and rise;  
leaders will bow in awe,  
because of the Holy One, who is faithful—  
the One who chooses you.”

### **John 1:29-42**

<sup>29</sup> The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and declared,  
“Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!  
<sup>30</sup> This is he of whom I said, ‘After me comes a man who ranks  
ahead of me because he was before me.’ <sup>31</sup> I myself did not know  
him, but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might  
be revealed to Israel.” <sup>32</sup> And John testified, “I saw the Spirit  
descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him.

<sup>33</sup> I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize  
with water said to me, ‘He on whom you see the Spirit descend  
and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.’ <sup>34</sup> And I  
myself have seen and have testified that this is the Chosen  
One.”

<sup>35</sup> The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, <sup>36</sup> and as he watched Jesus walk by he exclaimed, “**Look**, here is the Lamb of God!” <sup>37</sup> The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. <sup>38</sup> When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, “What are you looking for?” They said to him, “Rabbi where are you staying?” <sup>39</sup> He said to them, “**Come and see.**” They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o’clock in the afternoon. <sup>40</sup> One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother. <sup>41</sup> He first found his brother Simon and said to him, “We have found the Messiah” <sup>42</sup> He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, “You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Peter”
